### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

### 5.2 Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Hazards from the substance or

### 5.3 Advice for firefighters

Promptly isolate the scene by removing all persons from the vicinity of the incident if there is a fire. No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training. ### 6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

### 6.2 Environmental precautions

### 7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Vapors are heavier than air and may spread along floors. Vapors may form explosive mixtures with air. Prevent the creation of flammable or explosive concentrations of vapors in air and avoid vapor concentrations higher than the occupational exposure limits. In addition, the product should be used only in areas from which all naked lights and other sources of ignition have been excluded. ### 8.2 Exposure controls

### Appropriate engineering controls
